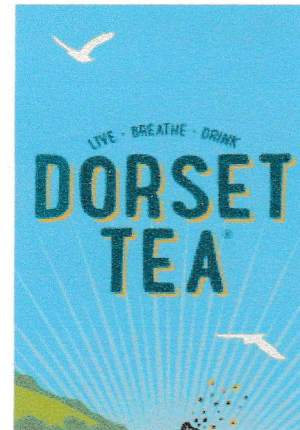

South West Tourism Awards sets new records

135 awards were handed out at this year's South West Tourism Excellence Awards which was the biggest ever gathering of tourism businesses in the region with 469 people booked to attend.

Amongst the winners at the ceremony held at Ashton Gate Stadium in Bristol, there was an Outstanding Contribution award given to Graham Grose, Owner of Thurlestone Hotel, and Harry Murray MBE, Chairman of Lucknam Park, both for their service to and their lobbying on behalf of the region's top industry. The Winner of Winners award went to the Gloucester Tourist Information Centre for their "innovation, consistency and service" over many years.

Gold awards went to Kaywana Hall, Devon and The 25 Boutique B & B, Devon for Bed & Breakfast of the Year; Cox and Baloney Tearooms & Bar, Bristol for Café & Tearoom of the Year; Lucknam Park Hotel & Spa, Wiltshire and The Manor House Hotel & Golf club, Castle Combe, Wiltshire for Hotel of the Year; The Coach House by Michael Caines, Devon for Restaurant/Bistro of the Year; The Millbrook Inn, Devon and The Rising Sun, Cornwall for Tourism Pub of the Year.
